

Community Safety Technology Roll-out Plan

ENGAGEMENT SNAPSHOT

The City sought community feedback on the Draft Community Safety Technology Roll-out Plan (the Plan), which proposes a staged approach to introducing new safety technologies across the City. The Plan aims to reduce crime, enhance public safety, support law enforcement and strengthen collaboration between the City and the community.

Consultation ran from **6 November to 14 December 2025** and invited residents to review the draft Plan, proposed CCTV locations and guiding principles for privacy and responsible technology use. Community members were informed through a mix of traditional and digital channels, including a dedicated project page, resulting in **402 submissions** being received.

The feedback received will help refine the final Plan, which will then be presented to Council for their consideration, ensuring the City's approach to safety technology is evidence-based, transparent and aligned with community expectations.

'There are no significant social or safety issues in this area to justify surveillance.'


'I support the plan in theory but would like more detailed information.'

ENGAGEMENT FINDINGS



*82% of submissions responded to the above.

Overall results show **moderate support across all proposed CCTV locations**, with consistent sentiment and mid-to-upper weighted scores.


Respondents highlighted three key pieces of **information needed to feel informed about CCTV**

1. Monitoring effectiveness (63.8%)
2. Where CCTV is installed (66.1%)
3. How footage is managed (60.9%)

Nearly one-third of respondents (30.9%) support mobile CCTV remaining longer if necessary.

 ● Very supportive




WE HEARD FROM
